Objectives in spending SPG:

- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport.

Summary of spending and actions taken:

1. **Working in partnership with the Colne Valley Consortium to provide high quality tournaments and festivals.** Currently NS is funded to work across the CVC providing a range of Level 1 competitions, tournaments and festivals for children across all age groups. Successful teams are then provided with the opportunity to go onto Level 2 county level competitions.
2. **Subscription to PE Association/CPD Providers** Required subscription providing best practice support, CPD and Health & Safety advice.
3. **Providing places for pupils at after school clubs.** Our school offers a range of before and after school clubs accessed by children from KS1 & KS2.
4. **Improving range of sports equipment for PE and Clubs in the school.** Range of new equipment purchased to allow for deeper development of skills and extension of pupils in PE.
5. **Targeted development of Dance teaching across the school.** Membership of Braintree Dance Alliance and Keeping Dance Alive allowing pupils access to a variety of Dance opportunities and providing excellent Dance CPD for the Sports Instructor.
6. **Launch of Health Ambassador Role.** Raised profile of Healthy minds, eating and bodies through new role. To include weekly workshops with classes and Gardening club.
7. **League entry.** Boys football league in Haverhill entered allowing weekly competitive sport against other schools
8. **Transport costs.** Support in transporting pupils to competitions, tournaments & festivals.
